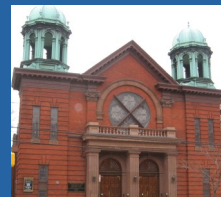

THE HOLOCAUST: ANNIHILATION, LIBERATION, RESCUE EXHIBITION

From April 2-30, the exhibition will be open to the
public at MU in the Ford Atrium, McComsey Hall.

The exhibition presents the story of Holocaust
atrocities committed on the territory of the former
Soviet Union, where almost half of all Holocaust
victims perished. It also shows the role of the Soviet
Army in liberating and rescuing the Jews from Nazi death
camps and commemorates the victims and liberators.

The exhibition, prepared by the Russian Research &
Educational Holocaust Center, with support of the Russian
Jewish Congress, is presented by the Museum of Human
Rights, Freedom, and Tolerance.

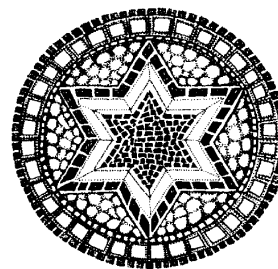
